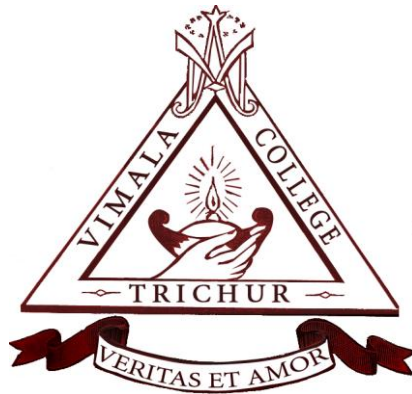

Dr Sr Lissy John Irimpan, Chairperson of the Governing Council, extended a warm welcome to the members of the Council. In the welcome address she mentioned the College's major activities since last Governing Council meeting, the awards and achievements secured by the academic community and also the new initiatives. The Chairperson also informed the members that the College has been selected as a participating institution under the Unnath Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), a flagship programme of MHRD, Govt. of India which aims at involving higher education institution in devising and ensuring government programmes in remote villages. The villages adopted under UBA are Madakkathara, Mulangunnathukavu, Kolazhy, Thekkumkara, Viltrattom. The College also has been selected as a mentoring college for five unaccredited colleges under UGC's Paramarsh Scheme. The Chairperson also mentioned about the certification process undertaken by the College such as NIRF and India Today.

Item 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting held on 27 June 2018.

The minutes of the previous meeting of the Governing Council held on 27/06/2018 was read out and the Council unanimously resolved to pass the minutes.

Item 2: Action taken Report

The Principal, who is the Ex Officio Secretary of the Council presented the action taken report on the resolutions of the previous meeting as given below:

1. Publication of the results

The result of the II & IV Semester UG & PG

examination held during March/April 2018 was published on 30 June 2018.

2. Bridge Courses for Complementary Course

The Department has prepared a syllabus for a bridge course in Chemistry for the students of 2019 admission. A procedure for this can be drafted by the department. A faculty has been deployed for the purpose.

3. Complementary Courses of Textiles and Fashion Technology

The Board of Studies of the University of Calicut arrived at a consensus that the two complementary courses offered now are not related to the core program. Therefore, it has been decided to change either one or both the courses and substitute the same with a course on Costume and Fashion designing at the next UG regulations meeting.

4. Remedial coaching for Mathematics courses

The Department conducted peer teaching to improve the performance of students in complementary course. 9 advanced learners were identified and each was assigned 4-5 slow learners. The focus was on additional practice exercises and extra coaching on complex concepts.

5. Remedial Coaching in English

Two students from the outgoing PG batch volunteered to offer remedial coaching for slow learners in the beginning of the year. But this could not continue as it did the previous year as these students got placement. So the department resorted to peer teaching. Advanced learners were identified and slow learners assigned. Peer teaching was also done during days when faculties were summoned to the valuation camps. Student teachers were assigned portions and exercises.

Item 6: Commencement of BLoc & Community College Programmes
 The Principal informed the Council regarding the commencement of BLoc Programmes and Community College. Uimala College has been approved as a centre by the UGC to introduce the following vocational programmes under NSQF (National Skill Qualification Framework) on 3 August 2018.

The BLoc programmes started are BLoc (Web - Technology) and BLoc (Food Processing).

The Community College Diploma Course in Interior Architecture and Design and Digital Video - Production Course commenced on 26 November 2018 and Tourism Management and Hospitality on 10 December 2018 as evening college with 15 students each, out of which 27 are male students.

The Governing Council resolved to ratify the decision to commence BLoc and Community College.

Item 7: Policy for Research and Consultancy

A policy for Research and Consultancy was formulated and placed before the Governing Council for approval and upload the same on the institutional website. The Council approved the Policy and resolved to upload the same on the institutional website.

Item 8: e-Governance: Annual Report

The Principal informed the Council regarding the constitution of a committee for e-Governance. The committee conducted a study on the current status of e-governance in the college and the requirements to enhance e-governance. The committee initiated various documentation initiatives aiming at 100 percent automation in the college governance. The annual report

Development Committee are:

1. To facilitate an integrated Management Information System.
2. To prepare the Enterprise Resource planning document.
3. To plan in anticipation of future growth of the institution.

The members of the committee will include the IQAC Coordinator, Controller of Examinations, the faculty in the working committees for documentation, e-governance, certification, and the Bursar. The committee will be headed by the Principal. The Governing Council resolved to approve the initiation of the Planning and Development Committee.

ITEM 10/GC/08.04.2021: Examination Manual- Minor Revision

The Council approved the modifications suggested by the Controller of Examinations on the Examination Manual of the College to be implemented w.e.f. November 2021.

The modifications proposed were:

1. Changes brought about in the CBCSS UG Regulations 2019 and CBCSS PG Regulations 2019 of the University of Calicut are incorporated in the Examination Manual. This is mainly related to changes in the grading pattern and composition of internal and external marks/grades.
2. Earlier double valuation was done in the case of PG answer scripts. Instead of that, it is proposed to appoint one Chief Examiner from outside the College by the CE for each subject. The Chief Examiner has to scrutinize every answer script and revalue 20% of the total answer scripts which are valued by an internal examiner.
