 The Students from Paalanam Club also actively participated in palliative care activities during the institutional care programme conducted by the Alpha pain clinic at various places in Thrissur District.







Report of Ability Enhancement Course (Audit Course) Conducted by Department of Zoology - Innovative Farming Techniques in collaboration with Rosen Fisheries, Marathakkara, Thrissur as a part of curriculum for increasing skill development in

#### Aquaculture

As a part of Ability Enhancement Course (Audit Course), twelve first year M.Sc

Zoology students visited Rosen Fisheries, Marathakkara, a private ownership aquaculture farm established in 1987 which is run by Mr C D Sebastian. Aim of the course was to get hands-on experience on new aquaculture techniques which can be utilised for their future employment opportunities and for improving their skill. The fee of this programme is Rs. 1500/-. The syllabus of the course include, Basic Concepts of Aquaculture, Pond based aquaculture system, Flow through System, Biofloc aquaculture system, Recirculation aquaculture system, Aquaponics and the recent trend on Aquaculture management and marketing.

The course started in July 2019. During the course the proprietor Mr C D Sebastian gave a talk on the importance of aquaculture and need for developing a Hi-Tech Aquaculture Farm and also a brief introduction on Biofloc aquaculture system he is practising in the farm. He explained the reduced availability of fish and shrimp from sea and other resources and the demand and enhancing price for seafood. Considering the advantage of natural facilities, quick turnover, assured return on investment, ready market and availability of vast stretch of suitable area at a cheaper rate etc. offer a golden opportunity for fresh water fish culture in Kerala and he started this farm in this vision. The species found suitable for this area are Tilapia, Nutter and Rohu. He also explained on the importance of Bio floc system, which is a super intensive system of aquaculture



in which the production level can be increased to 5 times of the conventional level. Students also learned on the bio flock system of aquaculture in detail and familiarized with the Azolla pond and small nursery tanks rearing the young ones. They also attended a detailed class on common cultivable fishes of Kerala like Catla, Rohu, Mrigal, Silver carp, Tilapia etc. They also learned the marketing and management techniques for fishes, aquaculture equipments, fish feeds (artificial and live), water quality test kits for testing ammonia, nitrate, nitrite etc. A class on aquaponics, which is the integration of recirculating aquaculture and hydroponics in one production system and the recirculation aquaculture system (RAS) and other traditional techniques is also conducted for students. After completing their internship, a written examination was conducted and the certificates were issued to all the students.




