Vimala College (Autonomous) signed an MoU with Alliance Francaise, Thiruvanthapuram on 04-02-2021 for the conduct of Add on course in French at Vimala College. 34students have enrolled for the Add on programme which is conducted online on the Zoom platform due to the Covid pandemic. The classes commenced on 9 January 2020. Ms Lakshmi TJ, a senior faculty of Alliance Francaise, Thiruvanthapuram is handling the classes for Vimala College. Each class of 2 hour duration is conducted from 4pm-6pm on Wednesdays every week. The 40 hour Add on certificate course is meant to give an introduction to French Language and Literature to the learner. The students are exposed to the basic grammar and vocabulary of French language through this customized certificate programme. 

Action Taken Report


