COLLEGE PROFILE

Vimala College Thrissur, a first grade residential women's college, Christian Minority Institution, under the CMC Management, was established in 1967, and is affiliated to the University of Calicut. The college has undergone three NAAC Assessments and has been accredited first with the then highest Five Star Status, Re accredited as A Grade with CGPA 3.3 and subsequently with the current highest A Grade with CGPA 3.5 on 4 point Scale. Vimala offers 16 Graduate and 13 Post Graduate courses, PG Diploma Courses and several other value added and Certificate courses. It is also a Research Centre for English, Commerce and Physics. This multi faculty institution has an enrollment of more than 2500 students. The Institution was accorded autonomy in 2015 and conferred the status of College with Potential for Excellence in 2016. ADMISSION

1. Certificates to be produced at the time of admission
 - a) Allotment Card
 - b) Transfer Certificate from the Institution last attended
 - c) Conduct Certificate from the Headmaster/ Headmistress/ Principal of the Institution
 - d) Original Mark list
 - e) Migration Certificate (Applicants coming from other Universities)
 - f) Equivalency Certificate (Applicants coming from other Universities)
 - g) Passport Size Photo- 4 copies
 - h) Other Certificates in Original
 - i) C.S.S. Certificate for P.G.
 - j) Students belong to SC, ST and OEC should produce at the time of admission, the caste certificates from the authorities concerned, to get the fee concession and other financial aids from the Government.
 - k) Other Backward and Forward Community students should produce Community and Income Certificates to get the benefit of fee concession.

- l) Students eligible for fee concession should submit the required certificates and fill the necessary application forms for the purpose as and when demanded by the office, failure of which will deny the fee concession to the Student.
 - m) NCC Certificate signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of NCC
 - n) NSS Certificate signed by the respective authority.
 - o) Certificates concerning widows and children of Jawans and Ex- Servicemen and Boarder Security Force Personnel killed or disabled in an action
 - p) President's Badges Scouts and Guides, outstanding records in sports and games – District, state or University
 - q) The *Catholic Students* should produce a Character Certificate from the Vicar of the parish in the prescribed form.(RCSC)
2. After the interview if the admission is sanctioned, then the applicant may get herself enrolled forth-with on payment of fees, if the candidate fails to appear for the interview at the time fixed her claim to the seat stands cancelled. At the time of admission, the student shall remit the required fees.
 3. The selected Candidates and their parents are required to read the Prospectus carefully and sign a declaration of compliance with the rules & code of conduct stipulated by the College before the payment of fees.
 4. Fees once paid will not be refunded. Any candidate admitted to self financing courses is required to pay the fees for the entire period if she discontinues the course.
 5. Original certificates submitted at the time of admission will not be returned to students during their course of study. **Students are therefore directed to keep at least 10 attested true copies of each Certificate before submitting the originals for admission.** The pass certificates will be returned to them at the end of the course.
 6. A student once enrolled for a course is expected to complete the same. If she withdraws from the College without taking transfer certificate, she will have to pay fees for the period of her name remains on the rolls.

ATTENDANCE

The minimum requirement of attendance during a semester shall be 75% for each course. Students can take maximum 9 days leave only in emergency.

CERTIFICATE COURSES

Skill based Add On/ Certificate Courses play a vital role in the integral development of the students. Each student is expected to join any course of her interest and benefit from it. Coaching is given for IELTS, IAS, other competitive exams and foreign languages in our college.

CGPT

The Career Guidance cell imparts training in various soft skills needed to get placement. Regular classes are conducted on topics like personality development, effective communication, higher education and job opportunities. The career guidance classes will be usually conducted on Thursdays. By maintaining wide contacts with various recruiting agencies, this cell keeps the students informed of the opportunities arising in different companies. Many students have secured placement in various banks and industries through campus recruitment.

EVALUATION AND GRADING

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts as the regulations of University of Calicut.

(1) Internal examination (2) External examination.

Of the total marks 20% marks is taken from the internal assessment. The remaining 80 % is external examination. Both internal and external evaluation will be carried out using Indirect Grading System.

GENERAL RULES OF THE OFFICE

The office functions from 8.30 am to 3.30 pm on all working days.

1. Application for a certificate should be addressed to the Principal
2. If a student desires to obtain a certificate (transfer, conduct, study, bonafide etc) she shall apply for the same in the college office and collect the same after a week.
3. All fees must be paid by the notified due date.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

1. All students are answerable to the Principal, Staff and other College authorities for their conduct and behaviour.
2. College begins at 8.25 am with Prayer. Classes commence at 8.30 am and close at 3.00 pm

3. Students are expected to be regular and punctual to each classes and the morning prayer, practical, seminars and other curricular and non curricular activities.
4. Attendance and active participation in all activities organized by College is compulsory.
5. All students are requested to read notices displayed on the notice boards.
6. Students are always required to wear their Identity Card.
7. Ragging is prohibited by Law. Strict action will be taken against its violation.
8. Mobile phones are not permitted in the Campus. If they are located by the 'squad', it will be confiscated and will not be returned.
9. The College property and furniture should be handled with great care. Any lose or destruction of these will be chargeable individually or collectively as the case may be.

DRESS

Rules of modesty, cleanliness and decorum should be strictly adhered to. *Plain saree and blouse or modestly stitched plain Salwar Kameez without slit and shawl of any shade without boarder or design or print is the College Uniform. Harem pants, Churi bottoms, patialas, leggings and short tops are not allowed.* The College special Uniform is to be worn on all First Mondays of every month and on special occasions. The Special Uniform for students of each batch should be worn on all other Mondays. The College Special Uniform and the special Uniform for each batch will be provided by the College. No gold or gold coloured imitation ornaments except ear-rings can be worn.
