## REPORT 2024-25 Department of Psychology


Third-year Psychology students from Vimala College visited St. Joseph's Special School, Cheroor for Mentally Challenged, to understand the educational environment and challenges faced by students with specific needs. The visit provided an overview of mental disorders like Autism and Down's syndrome, and offered insights into treatment and management. Students observed therapy sessions and engaged with students during classroom activities. The visit highlighted the importance of tailored support systems and empathetic engagement in fostering holistic development for students with diverse needs.



On 27<sup>th</sup> June 2024, The Department of Psychology held an interaction session for first-year B.Sc. Psychology students on pursuing higher studies in psychology. Alumna Ms. Parvathy Thondattil shared her experiences, emphasized the importance of choosing a program, gaining research experience, and networking. Practical advice on applying for graduate programs and balancing academic responsibilities were also discussed. The session provided valuable information and inspiration for students.



The Psychology department held a seminar on "My Story Entrepreneur" on July 12, 2024, at Marian Hall. On October 15, 2024, seven B.Sc. Psychology Honours students from Aashrayam College of Arts and Science, Kollengode, visited Vimala College (Autonomous), Thrissur, as part of a student exchange programme. The visit aimed to provide practical exposure through hands-on psychological experiments, as Aashrayam lacks a dedicated psychology lab. Under the guidance of Vimala's faculty, the students conducted four experiments, deepening their understanding of psychological concepts. On December 11, 2024, the Department of Psychology at Vimala College (Autonomous), Thrissur, in collaboration with the Digital De-addiction Centre, organized a seminar on "Digital Addiction and its Management." Ms. Aneesha Krishnan, psychologist from the Thrissur City Police's Digital De-addiction Centre, served as the resource person. The 3rd Year B.Sc. Psychology students conducted a Learning Disability screening at N.S.U.P. School, Mannumkad, for Grade 1 and 2 students from 2:00 PM to 3:30 PM. The screening aimed to identify early difficulties in reading, writing, comprehension, and numerical skills to facilitate timely intervention. With the support of cooperative teachers and staff, the process was efficiently organized. Most children participated enthusiastically, while a few showed signs of learning challenges, which were documented for further assessment. The initiative highlighted the importance of early detection in promoting academic and developmental support for young learners.



On January 24, 2025, the Department of Psychology organized a session on *Memory and Memory Assessment* at Government School, Villadom, from 2:00 PM to 3:30 PM. Fourth-semester B.Sc. Psychology students led an interactive session for 8th-grade students, introducing concepts of memory through engaging activities and games. Following the session, a memory assessment was conducted using the PGI Memory Scale. The program provided valuable hands-on experience for college students and enhanced awareness among schoolchildren about memory and its functions. The session concluded at 3:30 PM, marking a meaningful and educational experience for both groups.



On January 22, 2025, the Departments of Psychology and Zoology, in collaboration with the Institution Innovation Council, organized a seminar titled "Campus Founder: Introduction to Entrepreneurship" at the Zoology Lab. The session featured Mr. Vyshnav P G, founder and CEO of Psycholab, who shared his entrepreneurial journey, challenges, and insights.
