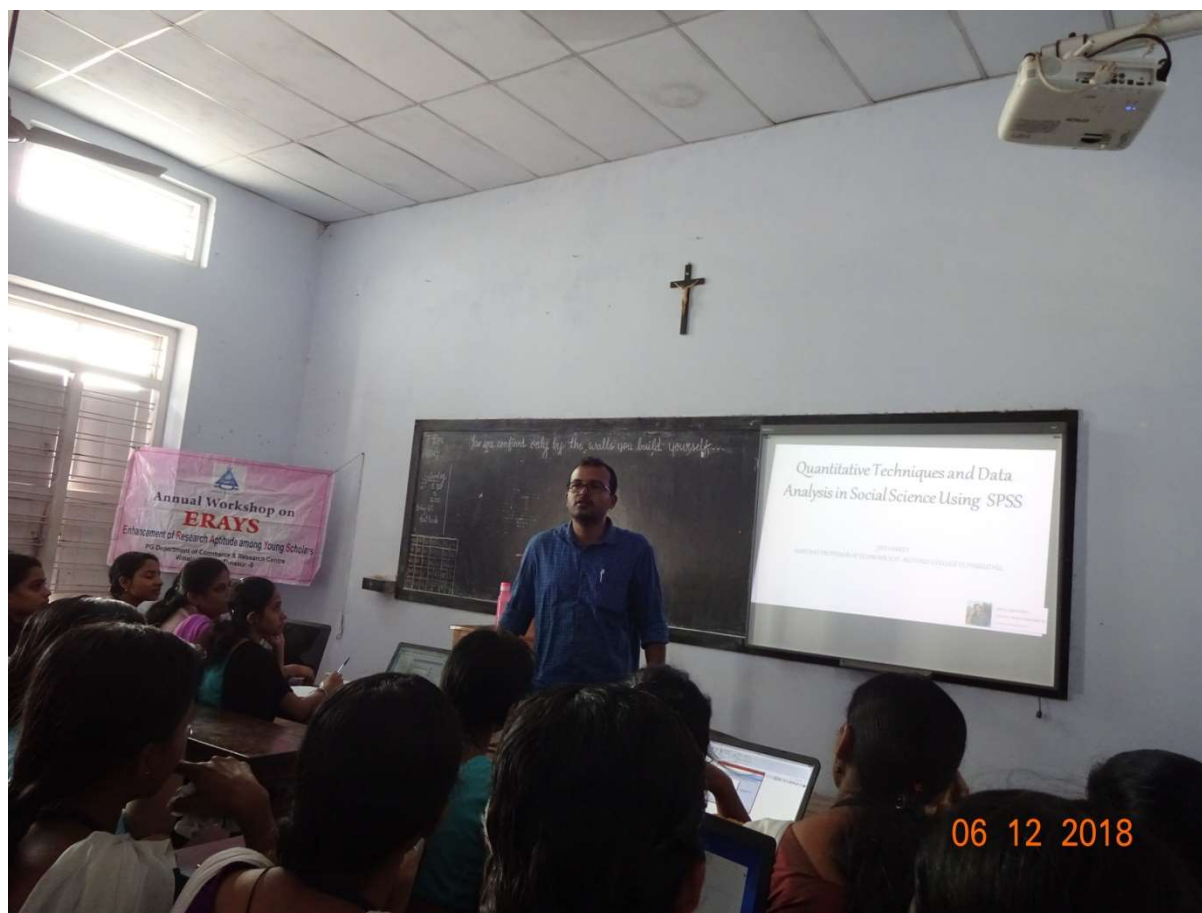


Departmental Activities 2018-19

1. ERAYS Seminar

13.Industrial Visit

An industrial visit was conducted by ED Club of Vimala College (Autonomous), Thrissur for the members of ED Club on **13/11/2018** to Athani Development Plot Manufacturer's Association (ADMA), Athani. It's an industrial estate where there are numerous industries. The visit consisted of 56 students assisted by Ms. Beny Paul E, ED Club Joint Coordinator and Assistant Professor on Contract of Department of Commerce and Ms. Mary Liya K R, Assistant Professor on Contract, Department of Commerce. The visit was guided by Mr. Girish ,employee of ADMA.

The visit started at 10.00 from Vimala College (Autonomous), Thrissur and we reached the destination by 10.30 a.m. The first visit was to **Yamuna Flour Mills**, a non-government entity. The main policy of the entity is to assure good quality products to the consumers. The main products are Atta, Maida , Suji etc. The factory consisted of 400 workers and their working hours is 12 hours. Next

visit was to **Pioneer Lamination and Solvents**. There are 12 workers in the factory and it's a label making factory. The labels are made for hospital products and other products like sewing thread etc. Pouching is also done in that factory. The next factory was an nail making factory, **Suresh Steels FIC Peringandoor (Avanoor Panchayath)**. There are 15 workers in the factory and mainly manufactured nails, +/B nails, stight wires. The visit was very helpful for the student to know about the factory environment and it was an opportunity for them to interact with the employees to know about their problems, to get an overview about the factory environment and the manufacturing procedures. After the visit we reached back to college at 1.30 p.m.



14.The Department of commerce in association with ED Club conducted an industrial visit to “**Ram Co. Industry Pvt Ltd** on 26/11/2018. It a toothpaste making factory with the brand name “**K.P. Namboodiri’s**”There were 61 students accompanied by two faculties Mr. Sojan Joseph, ED Club Coordinator and Ms. Beny Paul E, ED Club Joint Coordinator. We reached the spot at 10.20.a.m. The staff gave a brief introduction about the company. The entire group was divided into 10 batches and was taken into the factory. The visited was completed by 1.30 p.m. and reached college by 2.00p.m.



15. Entrepreneurship Club of Vimala College is conducting a Certificate course on “Soft Skills for Excellence”. 17.Farm Tourism

2018 was the year of young, urban farmers. If stats are anything to go by, it was for the first time since 1970s that the number of farmers aged 30 and under was on the incline. Farm- to- fork movement reached more households with young farming entrepreneurs delivering healthy goodness at our doorstep.

Farm tourism is the practice of attracting visitors and tourists to farm areas for production, educational, and recreational purposes which involves any agricultural or fishery-based operation or activity and may also provide a

venue for outdoor recreation and accessible family outings. Gaining inspiration from millennial farmers, it was decided to organise a visit to Rayirath Gardens and Kallingal Plantations and Mottamala on 1st December, 2018.

18. Rayirath Gardens

Rayirath Gardens is situated in eight acres in the valley of Vellani Mala of Pananchery Panchayath, the agricultural warehouse of Thrissur. By giving dreams and substance to many farmers it is poised to become one of the best nurseries in India. National and International awards and the only GMP certified nursery in Kerala, separates Rayirath Gardens from others. This establishment has now become a scholastic place for students, farmers and researchers.

The nursery also gives training and guidance to NGO's and self help groups for starting nurseries. Very rare medicinal plants, fruit plants are the speciality of Rayirath Gardens. More than five hundred rare plants like natural anti venom for snake bites, Analivegam, Cola Plant, karpooram, Krisnanal, Rudhraksham, Kunthirikam, Maravuri, Bhoothamkolli etc. are available in nursery. It also has a Birth stars tree garden.





19.Kallingal plantations and Nursery

Safeguards native varieties crops from extinction and provides planting material. Improves farm revenues with value addition and livestock rearing. Kallingal Plantation and Nursery is 25 acre integrated farm. Apart from the four main crops, seasonal vegetables and fruits are also grown namely mangoes, rose apples, jackfruit, rambutan, oranges, lime, guava and list goes on. “It is important to grow intercrops and have animal husbandry because it largely helps to attain the bio-diversity in the farm. Our entire farm is nurtured with the waste from trees and animal husbandry. This enables us to attain self-sufficiency to the best possible extent. We do use select chemicals inputs as required but the use is extremely limited,” persists Mr. Ciby.

Students were delighted to see different varieties of birds & animals apart from plants. Students were able to interact with Mrs.Swapna Ciby, our alumnae. She described the various methods to become successful in the field of farming.
